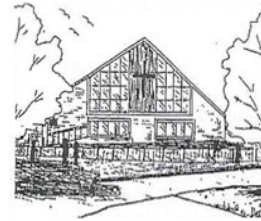

MAY THEY REST IN PEACE

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

First Reading: Wisdom 2: 12,-17-20 **Second Reading:** James 3:16-4:3 **Gospel:** Mark 9:30-37
19th September 2021

The Letter of James in today's second reading begins with: *Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice.*

There are so many problems that come from jealousy and selfish ambition. At work, people place a few negative thoughts into the ear of a boss in order to hamper a fellow employee's promotion and open up a position for themselves. In the schools, particularly the Senior Schools, people routinely destroy other's reputation so they can look better before their peers: "Well, she might seem to be all that holy, but let me tell you what she is really like." or "He might appear to be this great moral guy, but this is what he's done." And the hurt begins. Good people suffer.

Jealousy is evident in the families, workplace, schools, homes and even in the Parish. Jesus' closest disciples didn't get the message.

In today's Gospel the Twelve are arguing over who was the most important among them. What was with these people, anyway? They were following someone who gave up everything to care for others and to proclaim the Kingdom of God. He continually emptied himself out for others, and all they are concerned with is their positions in the heavenly kingdom. "Stop it," the Lord says to the Twelve. The first should be last and a servant. He would wash their feet at the Last Supper and then tell them to do this for others.

People can be hard. People can be hurtful. People can be jealous. But we do not have to be part of the self centred society of evil.

LIFTING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS AS OF 19TH JULY

The Guidance from the Government and the Bishops emphasises “local responsibility.” . We all have a responsibility to ensure that we keep each other safe; the virus is still with us and the number of infections is still rising. For the time-being please continue with the following:

1. Sanitising of hands when entering and leaving the Church.
2. **FACE MASK COVERINGS** to be worn while in Church. This is to protect yourself and others from being infected. I ask that everyone to play their part in this.
3. **TRACK AND TRACE** remains in operation.
4. The Church windows and doors will be open to ensure the greatest ventilation.
5. The Holy Water stoups are not refilled. People wishing to receive holy water may bring a filled bottle which I can bless it privately.
6. The Sign of Peace remains suspended as it is not an integral part of the Mass
7. Restrictions on Social distancing is removed. However, people should respect each other’s personal space.
8. Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind and distributed in the hand (not directly to the mouth).
9. The ‘One Way’ system will continue to be used for exiting the Church.
10. Those with ‘symptoms’ or who receive a National Health notification are not to attend Mass and should self-isolate until tested negative. This also includes if you have a cold or flu symptoms.
11. Please get the vaccine, if you have not already done so.
