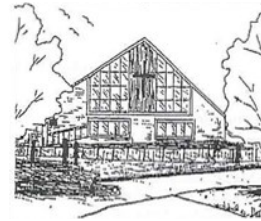

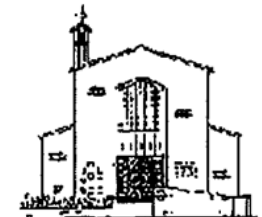

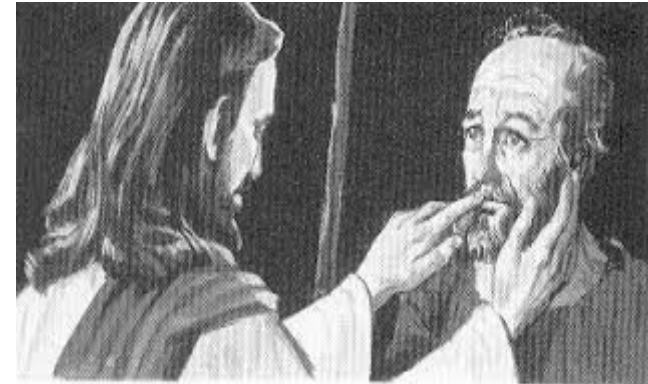
TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

First Reading: Isaiah 35: 4-7

Second Reading: James 2:1-5

Gospel: Mk 7:31-37

5th September 2021



Coraggio is a widely-used phrase in Italy, it means Courage, for the moments that need that little extra thrust. It is a warm-hearted phrase; it gives strength. When Cardinal Patriarch Albino Luciani of Venice was elected to his utmost surprise and trepidation, to succeed Pope Paul VI in 1978, as John Paul I, he told the people listening to his first Sunday Angelus message about this experience and how the Cardinal beside him took his hand and said ' coraggio, coraggio', thereby giving him a needed boost and support. It meant everything then. God is giving us a boost this Sunday and saying 'have courage' as he did through Isaiah to his people in a difficult time in their history, the history of salvation. 'Have courage; do not be afraid'- lovely words for all of us.

LIFTING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS AS OF 19TH JULY

The Guidance from the Government and the Bishops emphasises “local responsibility.” . We all have a responsibility to ensure that we keep each other safe; the virus is still with us and the number of infections is still rising. For the time-being please continue with the following:

1. Sanitising of hands when entering and leaving the Church.
2. **FACE MASK COVERINGS** to be worn while in Church. This is to protect yourself and others from being infected. I ask that everyone to play their part in this.
3. **TRACK AND TRACE** remains in operation.
4. The Church windows and doors will be open to ensure the greatest ventilation.
5. The Holy Water stoups are not refilled. People wishing to receive holy water may bring a filled bottle which I can bless it privately.
6. The Sign of Peace remains suspended as it is not an integral part of the Mass
7. Altar Servers may return to duty.
8. Restrictions on Social distancing is removed. However, people should respect each other's personal space.
9. Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind and distributed in the hand (not directly to the mouth).
10. The ‘One Way’ system will continue to be used for exiting the Church.
11. Those with ‘symptoms’ or who receive a National Health notification are not to attend Mass and should self-isolate until tested negative. This also includes if you have a cold or flu symptoms.
12. Please get the vaccine, if you have not already done so.

EDUCATION SUNDAY - Next Sunday is Education Sunday, and a message from Bishop Alan Williams will be read. We will also have a collection for the Catholic Education Service, the national body which looks after Catholic schools.

FRATELLI TUTTI - The second study day for the Season of Creation, on Fratelli Tutti, is on Saturday 2nd October, and will consider Pope Francis' encyclical letter about ‘fraternity and social friendship’. The event will be livestreamed from 11 to 12.30 BST. It will be free of charge and accessible all over the world. No registration necessary. This encyclical, issued for the feast of St Francis last year, challenges us to see the implications of faith in Christ in the face of the xenophobia and discrimination which are prevalent in so many societies all over the world. Our Catholicism has answers, and we need to consider them, and put them into practice.

CELEBRATING CREATION - The Season of Creation is being celebrated from 1st September until 4th October by thousands of Christians all over the world, united to pray and to take action in defence of our common home www.seasonofcreation.org A special Mass was held in our parish on 1st September with the presence of the little dog ‘Bonita’ to mark the beginning of this special time. At Masses today we shall be singing the hymn based on St Francis' special prayer ‘All creatures that on earth do dwell’. Please take the hymn sheets home with you and use the prayer during this special time.
