THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT [B] Gaudete Sunday

17th December 2023

First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11 Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28



The nickname for this Third Sunday of Advent, is "Gaudete...Rejoice". We can use rose coloured vestments today in imitation of the parallel Sunday during Lent, "Laetare...Rejoice". Today we have a slight relaxation of our penitential spirit as we prepare for the celebration of Christmas. Advent is a season of joyful penance.

Advent is a time of joy – joy in the waiting and this Sunday we wear the joyful rose-coloured vestment. The messenger in the first reading is the 'joyful messenger', and his joy is that God is near and God is coming. This would be the message of Jesus –that he was the joyful messenger of his Father's love. He would be the shepherd – the one who cares, knows and actively looks after the sheep. John the Baptist is the voice of joy and energy, preaching the new message.
