THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMES (B)

21st January 2024

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5,10 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Gospel: Mark 1:14-20

Making a decision at some point in our lives doesn't always mean that the case is comfortably closed. Sometimes we have second thoughts, get cold feet. Our sense of what is important may change or, as seems to have happened to the Corinthians in our Second Reading, we get distracted and caught up in everyday cares and anxieties.

These ambiguities are part of human nature and always have been. Our First Reading today deals with one of the Bible's most reluctant prophets. Jonah, having sought escape from God's call all the way to the belly of a whale, finally agrees to do what God asks and preach conversion to the people of Nineveh. His efforts are rewarded. The Ninevites believe, repent and in doing so, are spared. Paul's letter to the people of Corinth is a sort of echo of Jonah -time is short. We are called to live a good life, a holy life. Get things in perspective, hold things in proportion. But this call to conversion and discipleship comes at a price.

The Gospel this week again centres on the attractive presence of Jesus. It opens with the information that John the Baptist has been arrested. Having seen what happened to his cousin he must realise that he faces the same authorities. This makes Jesus' work urgent. His call is 'The time has come and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.' He proceeds to call Simon and his brother Andrew, and James and John, the sons of Zebedee. These men followed him. Something about Jesus drew them away from the comfortable and the familiar to answer his challenge. He invites them to change from fishermen to fishers of men.
