# TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

### 31st August 2025

First Reading: Sirach 3:17–18, 20, 28-29 Second Reading: Hebrews 12: 18-19, 22-24a Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7-14 The Gospel warns us against all forms of pride and self-glorification. The message is so obvious that we may fail to give it serious thought. We should take a hard look at ourselves for what we are. Pride is a road going nowhere. Like a frost which hips our spiritual growth in the bud, it makes us so selfcentred and full of our own importance that there is precious little place for God in our lives. Pride cuts us off from reality and makes us prisoners of ourselves. In God's eyes the proud person takes a very lowly place because God rejects the proud and raises up the humble-for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.

Sometimes we may put people down, but Jesus never did. He was always trying to lift people. This is because Jesus believed that people are the most important thing in the world. The soul of one person is worth more than the material universe and everything in it. Did he not say: "What does it profit a man if he gain the whole world and suffer the loss of his own soul?"

Humility is essential to the Christian life, it is fundamental. To become humble is painful indeed. It hurts-it hurts to be criticised, to be misunderstood, to be misjudged, to be snubbed, to be written off. None of us enjoy walking that way. We can be in the position of authority, rich and powerful, hold strings of degrees and still be humble and still admit that God is the source of all our accomplishments. As St Paul reminds us. "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him, "Humility, not pride, is the blessed way of the kingdom.

Humility is hard: It is not a sign of weakness. It requires honesty, diligent work and courage. But it brings the greatest rewards. Here and now, humility heals souls and heals relationships. But even more important, it makes possible a relationship with God. Humility opens the narrow door to eternal life.
