First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4–7 Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11 –16 Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

The parable in today's gospel it is about a rich man and Lazarus. The these two die, the rich man goes to hell; Lazarus, to heaven.

The rich man does nothing intrinsically evil. He lives like the rich man that he is, wears fine clothes, and throws a sumptuous feast each day. He neither curses nor kicks Lazarus when he passes him at the gate. He does not tells his servants to drive Lazarus away.

The rich person, traditionally called Dives, for the Latin word for "rich", lives his earthly days in abundance and his sin is that he ignores Lazarus. He does not lift a finger to help the man. He tells none of his servants to give the man food or drink. "The sin of the rich man was not that he did wrong things but he did nothing."

Today's gospel does not tells us to do anything spectacular for other people. We do not have to buy the homeless a house or give the hungry a food allowance for life. We are not expected to do anything out of the ordinary. Rather, we are simply asked to be there for someone in need.

We all have talents and gifts which we can make use of when extending help. If we have money to share with someone who is in dire financial straits, well and good. But if we really do not have the resources, God will not condemn us.

Jesus has very hard things to say about uncaring rich people. What do you think will happen to them on the Day of Judgement? Today, 'remember who you are' Take a good look around you at who and what you need to take notice of.

As Stephen Grellet puts it so beautifully: "I expect to pass through this world but once, any good thing therefore that I can do, or any kindness that I can show to any fellow creature, let me not defer or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again."
