Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

1st February 2026

First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13 **Second Reading: 1 Corin 1: 26 - 31** **Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a**
 In today's Gospel, Jesus presents us with what are known as the Beatitudes. The word beatitude literally means "happiness", "fortunate" or blessedness." Jesus' way of happiness, however, demands a conversion of heart which can only come about through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The beatitudes are a kind of recipe for happiness. It is important and remarkable to note, that they are not instructions as to what we must do, or not do, like the Ten Commandments. They are concise and brief sketch of what a Christians is. They comprise basic attitudes and values.. This is a necessary reminds that Christianity is more about the sort of person we are than a set of rules to be kept. What we do flows from who we are. Jesus taught us that what we have to change, with God's help, is what we are.

Today's Gospel, shows that God is there for everyone in every part of their life. In the ordinary times when we are faced with trials and tribulations, God is with us. It is in those places we do not expect to meet God that God draws near to us. No matter what we do, or don't do, God is always there with us all. And so we could run through a list of people whom the world might perceive as God-forsaken-the poor, those who mourn, the hungry, the persecuted-and Jesus tells us that all these are blessed in God's sight.

God meets us in our weakness, in our sadness, in our hunger for salvation and in our attempts to do what is just and right. God meets us in our pain and suffering when we are persecuted. God meets us in the cross that we share with Jesus. We meet God in many special ways, places and times in our lives, and often when we least expect. All that is asked of us is that we trust and believe in God.
