**Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)**

**18th January 2026**

**First Reading**: Isaiah 49:3,5 - 6 **Second Reading**: 1 Corin 1: 1 - 3 **Gospel**: John 1: 29 - 34

A popular conception of Christianity equates it with neighbourliness and good works. Sometimes people will say : “ I don't go to Church but I am a good a Christian as those who do.” The only response to such a statement that we don't go to Church because we are good but because God is good. For a Christian, the goodness of God is revealed in his Son Our Lord Jesus Christ. Christians are those who follow Him and acknowledge Him to be their Lord and Saviour. The response to the Psalm at Mass today is: 'Here I am, Lord , I come to do your will.'

Through our prayer and our reflection we as Christians are constantly seeking to discern what Christ's will for each of us really is and our faith and trust in Him leads us to do good and avoid all that is evil. Though we do not always achieve the high ideals of Christ and his Gospel, we try by a spirit of repentance and perseverance to open ourselves anew to his saving grace. We know Him to be the Lamb of God who takes our sins away.

The Prophet Isaiah had prefigured the death of Jesus when he described the servant of God as a lamb led to the slaughter, a lamb burdened with the sins of us all.

“Ours were the sufferings he bore, ours the sorrows he carried. But we, we thought of him as someone punished , struck by God, and brought low. He was pierced through for our faults, crushed for our sins. On him lies a punishment that brings us peace, and through his wounds we are healed.”

John used the phrase, the Lamb of God, 29 times in the Book of Revelation. It becomes one of the most precious titles of Christ. In one word it sums up the love, the sacrifice, the suffering, and the triumph of Jesus. Jesus was none than the Son of God.
